



English Language Lab

The English Language Laboratory is established to enhance students' proficiency in English for academic, professional, and social communication. It provides a technology-enabled environment in which learners systematically develop their listening, speaking, reading, and writing (LSRW) skills through guided practice and performance-based activities aligned with the AKTU syllabus.

The laboratory primarily emphasises the development of clear pronunciation, accurate stress and intonation patterns, appropriate vocabulary, effective sentence construction, and overall communicative competence. Through the use of audio-visual aids, language-learning software, recorded materials, and interactive tasks, students participate in presentations, group discussions, interviews, role-plays, and public speaking exercises. Continuous feedback from the instructor enables learners to recognise their strengths and identify specific areas requiring improvement.

Lab sessions are conducted under controlled classroom conditions, with the presence of two faculty members in each lab, to ensure individual mentoring and real-time feedback. Students' performances are recorded using high-quality equipment to facilitate detailed review and reflection. This arrangement enables learners to practice both individually and in groups, build confidence in real-life communication contexts, and prepare effectively for seminars, conferences, workplace interactions, and higher studies.
